For over 50 years, scientists have been conducting ESP research utilizing study methodology that has remained relatively unchanged. With the ubiquity of smartphones, there is now an opportunity to investigate the phenomenon of collective ESP among large groups of people. With the potential to have millions of study participants, the full scope of brain-to-brain communication can be scientifically evaluated. By utilizing multi-sensory stimulation at gamma frequencies, the True ESP app synchronizes the brain waves of people around the world as they participate together during real-time telepathy tests. From secure data collection using a robust research platform, to scalable datacenter infrastructure that can accommodate an unlimited number of users, this groundbreaking scientific study demonstrates the current state-of-the-art in telepathy research.

Innovation

Recent studies show that multi-sensory stimulation at specific frequencies can induce neural synchrony among people located thousands of miles apart. By creating a radically new approach for composing soundtracks using the iPhone's linear haptic engine, Mark Freeman has developed an innovative method for producing vibrotactile stimulation on a smartphone. These richly-detailed harmonic resonance patterns are used to synchronize the brain waves of study participants during ESP tests, and they have achieved extraordinary results throughout the preliminary trials. The primary innovation that makes this study possible is the True ESP app, which enables simultaneous telepathy testing for people around the world. As part of a robust research platform, this multifaceted app collects numerous streams of user data in real-time for conducting comprehensive scientific analysis.

Collaboration

Telepathy research typically has vocal detractors who make accusations about data manipulation and flawed methodology. To ensure the highest level of integrity, we are collaborating with a team of trusted researchers at the Institute of Noetic Sciences (IONS), who will oversee all aspects of data collection and analysis. With their accredited Institutional Review Board, IONS will ensure that all study activities are strictly monitored to comply with ethics and safety standards. The distinguished scientists at IONS will conduct their own independent research study using de-identified test data from the True ESP app, for the purpose of publishing their peer-reviewed study in a prominent scientific journal.
